



SB Inc , USA – Kenya Education of Youth, This is just one of charities supported through their Nomination Scheme



# Group Matched Funding Scheme Circa £20,000 raised, highest amount ever!

Another successful year for matched funding with colleagues from South Africa, Croatia, USA and the UK participating in this scheme. 27 charities, local, national and international received double what they would have received due to the Company matching the amounts raised £1 for £1.

# Highlights



Ebola Disaster - Charity and Company working together - £5,000
